Summary of Stakeholders' Feedback on Curriculum 2017-18

Students:

- 1. Special guidance and counseling should be provided to pass JAM/ GATE/ NET/SET examinations.
- 2. Special programs/ events should be organized for personality development/ soft skill/competitive examinations.

Teachers:

- 1. Syllabus should be according to requirement of employment.
- The study of 8085 microprocessor should be included in the course Digital system and Microprocessor (1MCS1) in MSc Computer Science Program.
 Employer:
- Commerce curriculum to be more need based and special course on GST may be offered.
 Parents:
- New PG courses in science faculty may be introduced.
 Alumni:
- 1. Introduction of Ethics (including being truthful in data generation, error propagation and documentation) and laboratory safety and chemical hazards in chemistry syllabus.
- 2. Syllabus should be set which improve practical knowledge important in Industries.
- 3. Coaching for effective communication is required
- 4. Commerce curriculum should be more career-oriented.

Action Taken Report:

- New courses like BSc-Microbiology and short-term courses like Certificate Course in General Organic Chemistry, GST assistant, Internet of Things (IoT), Microsoft Technology Associates, Child Development behavior and counseling, Food processing, preservation and marketing and Soil testing are offered.
- Necessary steps have been taken to introduce MSc Mathematics and MSc Botany from the session 2018-19.
- 3. Various programs for soft-skills and personality development have been frequently offered.
- To fill the skill-gap between academic curriculum and needs of the industry, we entered into a MoU with Shodh Advantech which provides training, counseling for soft-skill and lab-skill development.
- Suggestions regarding a) incorporation of ethics and safety in the Chemistry and b)
 Microprocessor 8085 in MSc Computer Science course have been communicated to the
 university.
- 6. Dr R R Gavhale (Dept of Economics) suggested that implementation of semester system for BA is not practicable during the university level symposium.
- Teachers are encouraged to make more use of ICT for effective curriculum delivery and necessary infrastructure for the same has been upgraded.
